Thanks to all five of these people and to all the others who stepped in and kept HCC activities running this summer.

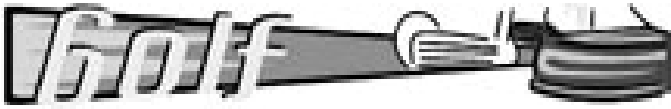

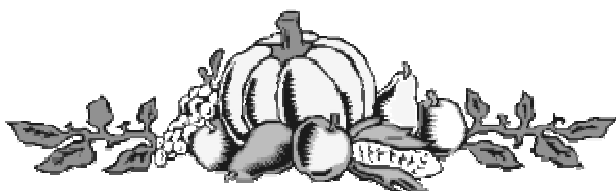

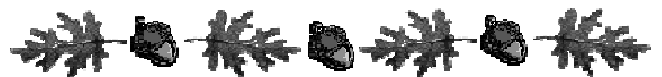


## CASINO TRIP

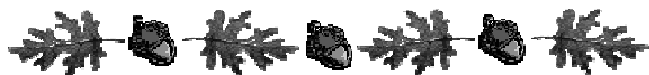

Have you tried WII Bowling? Do you know what it is? If not just ask one of your young grand kids and they will clue you in.

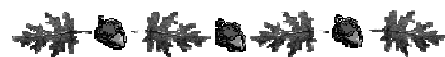
Loretta Poe and Barb Peters at "great" expense of time and no money learned how to play WII and set up the game each week. Are they experts now? No way, but it is fun.

## **HOMECOMING BLOCK PARTY WITH APRIL WALKER**

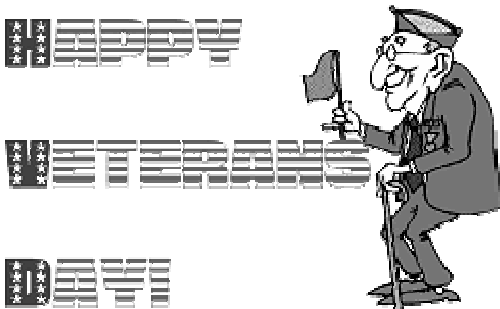
This year our Homecoming event will be a block party right in front of the Billard Hall, on Juniper, on Saturday, November 7th. starting at 3:45 PM.

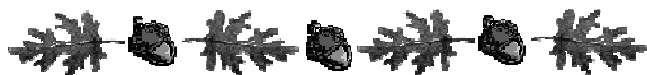

Also, please do not leave your pet outside alone (even if you are home). This is a violation of our pet policy.

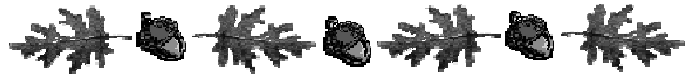
