then its beauty overflows

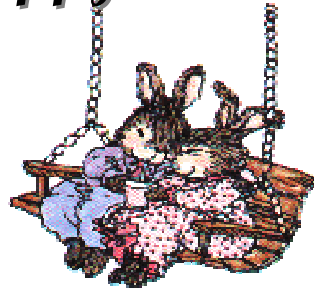

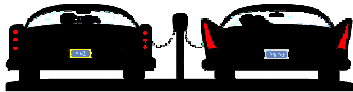

AND YOU

Recently a group from our park attended an educational session sponsored by the Arizona Association Manufactured Home & R. V. Owners (AAMHO). We reviewed the Mobile Home Parks Residential Landlord and Tenant Act (LTA) which outlines what responsibilities any park management has toward the residents of that park. The LTA also outlines what a park management may expect from its residents. If you want to read a copy of the law, contact Thom Feit at 480-656-0826.

Over fifty AAMHO members from parks across the valley heard detailed discussion of the section of the law that dealt with: "Landlord to maintain fit premises." Lead by AAMHO President Ron Feinstein, the discussion was filled with past examples of issues from a wide variety of residential parks. Issues included common areas, streets, utilities, flow of water and landscaping. While it is dangerous to make sweeping statements, President Feinstein led one to believe that since residents do not own the land, management does have responsibility in many of these cases.

Our local officers have created a Park Improvement Committee to explore paths available to our residents in addressing their concerns. If you are interested in membership in our local, please contact Treasurer Irene Helm, #227, 248-7998.
