LADIES LUNCHEON

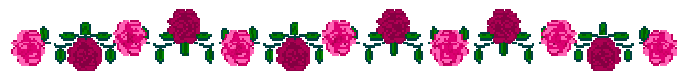

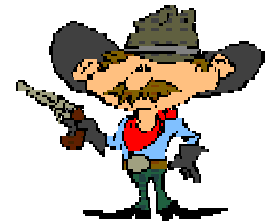
